In Their Shoes Day

On Friday, Week 6, Year 6 participated in 'In Their Shoes Day' where they experienced what it is like to live in poverty. They were tasked with the challenge of not eating, only being provided with one meal of rice for the day. They also had to collect their own water, carrying a bucket to and from St Francis to use as their drinking water for the day. They completed activities throughout the day that focused on those who are less fortunate than us. In particular, they watched Ryan's Well, a story about a young boy who raised his own money to build a well at Angolo Primary School in Uganda. Year 6 learnt from Ryan that, 'Water is essential to all life and that it was a reminder that we can all make a difference – it applies to each and every one of us.' Below are some reflections from our Year 6 students:

Beginning of the Day

I am feeling quite moved by the video we just watched. I never really realised the velocity of this situation. They say water is life. Yet, so many people are dying without water. It is so incredibly sad. - **Anuj**

After we watched the video and said prayer I was a bit sad, because 1 in 4 people in this world do not have access to clean water, and 1 in 3 people lack sufficient access to basic sanitation. I remember these people in my prayers so I can help them. - **Adil**

During The Day

A bowl of rice has never tasted so good after not eating anything, unlike what we would do in our everyday lives. Eating something like rice which would normally be a side food has become a survival food ... for those people who are living in poverty. I have never appreciated our food before, until we saw and were put into the situation of other's lives. - **Maria**

I can't believe how little some people in the world eat every day. I feel hot and exhausted already, I can't imagine how others feel. For us, it's just one day. People live like this over and over again, and they can't complain because that's what they're used to... We are truly lucky. - **Adele**

I find it extremely annoying that western society takes too much food and doesn't donate the stuff they don't eat. Instead, we keep food in our cupboards until it ends up being thrown out. There are 828 million people around the world that could eat that food! - **Ben**

I can't believe the amount of people that go hungry in the world, and very little of us help, very little of us cared, because we were never in their position. I wish my eyes had opened up earlier. I feel good that going out of this experience, everyone has raised more awareness and gratitude. - **Alexis**

After the day

After today I finally see how lucky I am to have these privileges. I see how lots of people around the world don't have clean water and food - they might be starving. That's why I am grateful that I have food, clean water and the other privileges that I have. I hope that in the future we will finally find a solution to getting clean water and food for all the underprivileged people of the world. - **Tanya**

I am so grateful that I got to experience this, so that I can feel what it is like to be in someone's shoes. It was amazing to eat again at the end of the day but I deeply understand the privileges we have compared to others in the world. - **Annica**

After my evening meal I realised that I shouldn't take things for granted and I should be grateful for what I have. I know it was only a day experience, but people living in poverty have to go through that every day not knowing when their next meal is. - **Lilly**


















Guitar and Voice Lessons


